Third Session

DISEC and UNODC Overview

In each committee, blocs were formed throughout yesterday and earlier today and have established their positions on the subjects of discussion. After interviewing delegates and blocs in nearly every committee, TASS has analysed each bloc's position on the various subject matters developed throughout the conference.

In the DISEC committee, three major groups have formed, named the ICE bloc, the IBC bloc, and the RISE bloc. Yesterday, TASS had the honor of holding a press conference in front of the DISEC committee, where we asked each bloc to present the problems that they are trying to solve and how they are trying to solve them. Each bloc in the committee mostly focused on the same problems, but had alternate solutions. Interestingly enough, this occurrence happened in each committee, where the same issues were debated with different solutions. Each bloc in DISEC dove into the

issues with giving visas to immigrants; the ICE bloc prioritized background checks, the RISE bloc centered around accessibility to visas as well as strengthening border security so as to limit illegal immigrants, and the IBC bloc had the unique perspective of focusing on online access for visa applications.

The UNODC committee also debated the right to sovereignty for individual nations. The FAT bloc established that they wish to propose a legal framework to help smaller nations develop, while trying to maintain their sovereignty. The S2M bloc, headed by the Russian Federation, proclaimed that they wish to promote full sovereignty to all nations by helping smaller nations develop through the proposed use of MoneyCoin, an international cryptocurrency regulated by the new International Coin Bank and backed by the gold standard. Another important aspect of this bloc the relaying of information of criminals between signatory states. This will allow every criminal that escapes to a

different country to have a much better chance of being caught.

The UNEP committee continued discussion about the importance of nuclear energy in today's society, and mostly how it impacts the average person. The REFA bloc, specifically the Russian Federation, has stated how nuclear energy is the field of tomorrow, and how human invention had brought civilization to the point of nuclear capabilities. They also wish to provide funding to smaller nations so that they could continue nuclear research. This funding would be paid by a global tax on nations by a percentage of their GDP. Additionally, REFA aims to share nuclear technology between participating nations so as to not let the larger nations representing the bloc gain too much nuclear power. The NNN bloc stayed firm on their stance that nuclear energy should only be used when necessary, and that regulations should be placed not only on nuclear facilities, but various other organizations as well. Nevertheless, both blocs agreed that if nuclear energy does become a global

phenomenon, people will be required to change their profession to accommodate this change. Both blocs included clauses that help the average laborer transition into a new market, mostly by providing better education at no extra cost.

The UN Security Council also was split in two blocs, the SUSS bloc and the PDA. The SUSS bloc, lead by Russia, Algeria, and Panama focused their paper on providing humanitarian aid to people impacted by the war-torn Levant region. Additionally, they proposed holding conferences between nations to potentially resolve the issues plaguing the Middle East. The PDA bloc, headed by France and the United Kingdom, established their goal to expand the UNIFIL program (United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon) into regions like Israel, Gaza, the West Bank, and potentially even Syria.

These committees have continued to debate their issues throughout the third session of the conference, and have gotten closer and closer to finding a resolution. TASS will stay informed on which resolutions are passed on each committee and how they will affect the average Russian citizen's life.

‘How many more innocent lives will the west take to remain influential?’ asks China after Isreali attack on the Lebanese border

Fear and confusion have been on the rise in the Levant region after an Isreali strike occurred this morning on the home of Hezbollah official J. Mohammed. Sources say that his home was bombed while he and his three wives were away, killing their children, maids, and many in the surrounding area. This attack has left Mr. Mohammed and his wives devastated as they grieve the loss of their home, pets, friends, and beloved family. The UN Security Council was quickly informed of the events of this tragedy earlier today.

The NSPDA bloc (consisting of Isreal, the United States, the United Kingdom, and France) was quick to argue that this event

was justified as it was a necessary step to take to bring an end to the sheltering of a terrorist. The delegation of Isreal went as far as to say they are “wholly unapoligetic” for what has happened, and that they do not feel it necessary to elaborate on their actions any further.

On the other side of the room, the SUSS bloc would make claims of terrorism against Isreal and the United States, saying that they were continuing to harm civilians and families purely in the name of money and power. China then provided a question that resonated powerfully throughout the room: “How many more innocent lives will the west take to remain influential over nations they cannot control otherwise?”

With even more conflicts presenting themselves than before, and tension in the Security Council at its all time highest, the question still remains, will they come to an agreement? We here at Al-Jazeera wish the delegates best of luck, and give our deepest condolences to Mr. Mohammed and his spouses at this time.
